

Welcome to this edition of our school newsletter. I hope you are all well and enjoying the increasing amount of sunshine we are experiencing. It is always good to have sunny days, even if we have a bit of a cold start first. I know our children really enjoy getting outside when the weather allows.

From next week the school office and all in the administration area will be moving into our recently refurbished classrooms. This will allow our builders to refurbish our administration area, and eventually our Hall. This will be the last stage of our refurbishment, and will hopefully be finished by the beginning of next year. At that stage the Board will be looking at our landscaping and enhancing our school environment. In the meantime we have established three raised garden beds in front of Rooms 12 and 13. The plan is to use these beds to grow vegetables and herbs for use in our foods room – something that I believe our children will enjoy and learn from. However, we need some soil to complete our project. If you know anyone who may be able to donate, or supply at a reasonable price, some screened topsoil we would love to talk with them. Please just ask them to contact the school office or myself. Thanks for considering this.

We are very fortunate to be hosting two teacher trainees from Korea for the next short while. Jun and Kelly are working in Rooms 6 and 4 and are very much enjoying the experience. We hope they will take good memories of their time with us when they return home. We are also fortunate in hosting a Technology teacher trainee. Mr Renwick is working with Mrs Rowe in the foods area. We also wish him all the best during his 8-week teaching practice with us.

I have no doubt that you will be hearing much from the current government about education and the achievement levels of students. Any progress that can be made to improve educational outcomes for children will be welcomed by our school. We know that there are many factors outside of school control, things such as poverty, poor housing, inequity in society to name only three. One of



the other factors that we can all do something about though, is school attendance. This can be a contentious area. On the one hand if your child is sick, we think they should not come to school. However, how sick is too sick? And then, how long should they be away? There are good resources and information available on the Ministry of Education's website, and also on the Ministry of Health's website. I would suggest that if you are unsure, reading these may be of value. However, there is another kind of absence – absence by choice. As a parent it is up to you to make the decision as to whether your child comes to school or not. When making that decision please remember that every day your child misses school, they miss learning, and they miss social interaction and growth. Please consider what the effect of absence today means for your child's future. As the Ministry of Education says, "Every Day Matters".

Our Tuesday Winter Sports programme has finished for the year, In general we have been really pleased with the attitude of all children taking part, and also those children who have remained at school. A big thank you to all staff and parents who have supported our children. Without parent help we would be very restricted to the numbers of children we could involve.

Enrolments for 2025 are due into the school office by 31 August. The Board resolved at our last meeting to increase the number of out of zone places for Year 7, 2025 to 140 places, so there should be plenty of room for all who want to attend. At the same meeting the Board resolved to reduce the number of out of zone places for Year 8 2025 to 15, to ensure our Year 8 classes do not become too large. If you know of anyone wishing to enrol their child here for next year, please encourage them to put in the application form by the required date.

Thank you for your continued support of our school. Remember that we are here to work with you as your child goes through our school.

We have a Teacher Only Day on **Thursday 14 November**. Therefore school will be closed on this day. The following Friday 15 November is a public holiday.




