## KickStart Breakfast Programme

This month Ray Ingle and I were invited to the Christchurch Town Hall, along with other key volunteers and coordinators, to a special function celebrating 15 years of the KickStart Breakfast Programme.

The KickStart Breakfast Programme has been instrumental in ensuring that students start their day with a nutritious breakfast. Since 2009, there has been more than 70 million breakfasts and run in over 1,400 schools nationwide.

This event aimed to recognize and celebrate the incredible efforts of the volunteers and coordinators who make these Breakfast Clubs possible as well as provide a wonderful opportunity to connect with those who share the passion for supporting our students well-being and success.

I was asked to speak at the event where I commented " I feel like the students who could benefit from the programme are often the ones that don't utilize it for various reasons". There is absolutely no judgement of who comes to breakfast, it could be that they have had really early breakfast before catching the bus so come for a second breakfast, they got up late, there was nothing at home for breaky or they just want to come and hang out somewhere in the morning and catch up with their friends. Having breakfast is important in helping our students to thrive academically and personally.

Breakfast Club at Kirkwood is run in T8 every morning (except Thursday) 8:00am - 8:35am providing students a range of breakfast options. Fonterra and Sanitarium provide weetbix and milk and I have also got Countdown Church corner involved in the programme and they kindly provide Milo, toast, spreads and other cereals.
