

Kia ora and nau mai to the latest Kirkwood Newsletter. Term 4 always has such a positive feel as the weather continues to improve, our Year 8 students start to prepare for new opportunities at high school and our Year 7 students look to become our leaders for 2024. Five classes have moved into our newly refurbished classrooms and feedback from students and teachers has been extremely positive.

Our new Library is also completed and almost ready for students. The finishing touches are being applied and we will have a blessing and opening ceremony next week on Wednesday 18 October. Students and classes will begin to use the new Library from Thursday next week. The librarians have already had a chance to see the new space and they are confident the students will be impressed.

As the weather heats up we need to keep sun protection in mind. We have moved the lunch eating areas to spaces which have the option of shade and all of the classes have sunblock available to students. Students are encouraged to bring in hats to use at break times or before and after school. Students are not restricted to a uniform sunhat. A sunhat that they prefer or have at home already is fine.

We have Year 8 students preparing for camps over the next few weeks. Rooms 3, 4 and 11 are on camp next week (Monday 16 - Thursday 20 October). While Rooms 5, 12 and 13 are on camp the following week (Tuesday 24 - Friday 27 October). We have our fingers crossed for fine weather and hope that all those involved will make the most of all the opportunities camp offers.

We have a Teacher Only Day coming up on Monday 20 November. We are sharing this Teacher Only Day with many of the other intermediate schools in Christchurch to work together to deepen our knowledge around the curriculum refresh. School will not be open for instruction on this day, you will have to make other arrangements to look after your child.

We have two sets of transitions happening at this time of year. Our Year 8 students are moving to high school and our Year 7 students are moving into Year 8.

For our Year 8 students, transition often includes open days and assessment days for the students. The classroom teachers are also asked for information by the various high schools and we also host a hui for the main high school Deans to help share information smoothly. It would be a real help if whānau can let the office know if students will be absent from school for Open Days or high school assessments. If

you feel that your child would benefit from additional transition support and you have not already been in talks with us about this, let the office know.

For our Year 7 students, we are beginning to think about classroom placement for Year 8. Some parents may have made placement requests last year, but some of these requests may no longer be relevant as students have settled and become confident at Kirkwood. If you have requests that you would still like to be considered or you have new requests around placement, please let the office know. We will do our best to accommodate these.



# Lincoln High Enrolment

If your child is going to Lincoln High in 2024 and has a formal diagnosis which will allow them to have a reader/writer for the testing on Thursday 2 November, please contact either Lincoln High Learning Support team or Janine Climo (SENCO) at Kirkwood as the school has specific criteria and limited spaces to have reader/writers.

Lincoln High has stated the following:

- Please note it is your responsibility to provide the reader/writer for your student. If they turn up on the day without a reader/writer they will have to be placed with the other students.
- Please also note we require a copy of supporting diagnosing report i.e. Seabrook report or other education psychologist report. We will follow up with families to ensure we have the paperwork required.
- Our Learning Support Department will use the report(s) to ascertain
  the best support for transition and learning needs for these
  students. These reports are also required as evidence if we do
  applications to NZQA for Special Assessment Conditions.
