But after a big day of walking and learning it was really nice to go back and relax in our bunkrooms at the Haka House with our friends!


The ferry and the train ride was also a beautiful scenic experience for everyone because for many of us it was our first time on a ferry or a train.



Mental Health Awareness Week

Last week classes and groups did a range of activities focused on the important of positive mental health and well being. This year the nationwide theme was Community is What We Create Together. This theme arose from the challenging last few years we have all had and how we can get through these difficult times by coming together as communities so that a sense of belonging, purpose and connectiveness is achieved for everyone.

The Ways of Wellbeing framework is a great starting point and applies to all of us no matter what our individual and community connections:

Staying connected: talking and listening, being there.

Being active: do what you can, enjoy what you do, focus on having a positive mindset.

Give: your time, your words and your presence.

Take notice: remember the simple things that give you joy.

Keep learning: embrace new experiences, see opportunities, surprise yourself.

Also regularly using the Pause, Breathe, Smile Mindfulness strategies particularly Mindful breathing. Allowing time to be calm, appreciate what you have around you, giving yourself space to think and to reflect on your personal goals and achievements no matter how big or small all contribute to our happiness and the happiness of those around us.

Last week a group of Kirkwood students went to Ilam School to read stories and do some activities with junior school students. This was our way of reaching out to our local community. The 5 and 6 year old children were delightful and the Kirkwood students came away feeling really good that they had made connections even in a very short time with many children. The Kirkwood students, without exception said they loved the experience, wanted to stay longer, enjoyed the hugs they received from a number of children and were amazed at how well they listened and responded to them.

These are just some ways parents can use the Ways of Wellbeing framework at home with their children:

Stay connected: asking about how the day went, sharing how your day went, what were the positives, eating dinner together, watching children play sport or other extra curricula activities, staying aware of events at school.

Being active: doing physical activities together such as going for a walk through native bush or a pleasant spot, playing games with your children, trying new physical activities together.

Give: be present in your child's life, having a clear set of family values that are respected and treasured, having set times where there is no cellphone use by adults or children, listening and being encouraging, knowing your children's friends and their parents.

Take notice: listen to the sounds of birds in the morning, actively watch the spring growth and talk about it with your children.

Keep learning: try new experiences that don't need to cost money such as going to a different park/place, go for a walk or bike ride somewhere new, try new foods that you have researched and cooked together.

During COVID times many families became very creative with ways of staying connected and having fun together in a world where there were many restrictions. While this was a very difficult time, these were the positives. Keeping that mindset going is a challenge for us all but really worth it.






SCIENCE
