

Welcome to this edition of our school newsletter. The usual fluctuations of Spring weather continue. We are hoping for some fine warm weather to allow us to start using our swimming pool – it seems unlikely after this week, but we are looking forward to sunshine soon!

The Year 8 camps have been completed for this year. We acknowledge all the help and support we have received from our families. A real highlight for me was being able to attend one of the whānau evenings – it was really good to see such a large number of people supporting both the camp and their children. While we have enjoyed using Omaka as our Year 8 campsite we are considering a return to Wellington next year. We are currently looking at costing and accommodation options. We intend to be able to tell our 2024 Year 8 families early in the New Year if this will be a possibility, along with an estimate of costs. Our Year 7 camp next year will be held at Ōnuku Marae – a little different than in previous years but this should be a very good experience for all involved. Again, more details including costs will be available in the New Year.

As part of the end of year proceedings the Board has agreed to support a hāngi for our Year 8 students. Our Kapa Haka tutors will manage the hāngi, but may ask for help closer to the time. We really would like all of our Year 8 students to participate, so while we will be asking for a financial contribution towards the costs, this will be optional – if families can't afford this then please don't worry, we will access other funding to support our children. Please feel welcome to contact me if you have any concerns. Next year we will hold a hāngi as part of our welcome to our Year 7 students at the beginning of the year, and the 2024 Year 8's will have their hāngi at the end of 2024.

At the last Board meeting we discussed our Strategic Goals for the next two years. Included in this newsletter are the three Strategic Goals the Board are considering. As a part of our consultation process the Board invites you to look at these goals and talk with your friends and whānau to determine if they suit our community. You are welcome to comment on these by emailing the school

or calling and talking through your thoughts. All comments are welcome and appreciated. It would be very helpful if you could share your thoughts by the end of next week if at all possible.

Please remember that next Friday 17 November is Canterbury Anniversary Day. Monday 20 November is our final Teacher Only Day for this year. School will be closed for these two days. We appreciate your understanding and ask that you make arrangements for your child/children not to attend school on these two days. Thanks very much.

With the on-going refurbishment of our school our Hall remains unavailable for large gatherings. We are currently in negotiation to find a space to hold our Year 8 final assembly, and we are hopeful that we will be able to invite families to attend as well. There will be more information available to Year 8 families soon. Our Year 7 final assembly will be held at school. With such limited space available we ask that this assembly be for children only. Again, more details will be available soon.

Thank you for your on-going support of our school. As the end of the year draws ever closer, we ask that you continue to support our school by reinforcing that our school rules – including uniform – will remain the same for the whole school year. Your support is much appreciated.


